

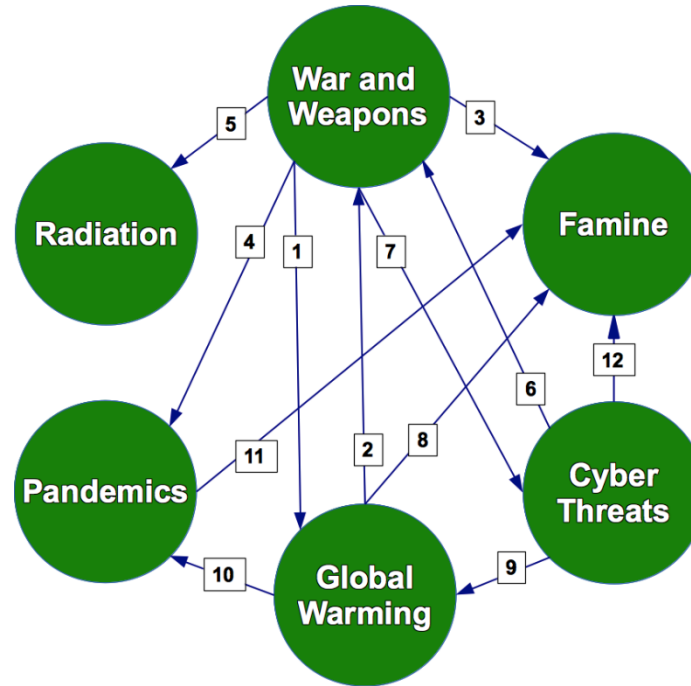
The six threats in our diagram are an interdependent system. None of them can be solved without addressing one or more of the others. And for that we need a “**social movement of social movements.**”

We invite you to spend two days with experts and activists, picking the 25 most useful policy changes for the whole world to adopt to reduce the risks.

The Program

Wednesday, May 30: Professor **John Polanyi** will launch the program, followed by:

- Disarmament Ambassadors **Douglas Roche** and **Peggy Mason** on war;
- **Gordon Edwards** and **Angela Bischoff** on radiation risks;
- UN Rapporteur on Food **Hilal Elver** and Professor **Evan Fraser** on famine;
- **Drs. Larry Brilliant** and **Ronald St. John** on pandemics;
- **Danny Harvey**, **Mark Z. Jacobson** and **Catherine Abreu** on global warming;



The intersecting arrows on the diagram show relationships between each global threat and the others; for instance, global warming affects pandemic disease, which in turn has an effect on famine, while war and global warming both have reinforcing effects on each other. On Wednesday evening we will have dinner together and hear a talk by the *Globe and Mail* columnist **Doug Saunders**.

On Thursday, May 31 we will hear expert analyses of the political and economic changes required to enable the other policy changes we are considering.

Then we will break into smaller groups. Each one will discuss and pick the most promising three policy changes for its threat. We'll compile all 25 of them as a shared “vision of tomorrow” — a one-page-long “**Platform for Survival.**”
