- Participating in the International Peace Bureau and the United Nations NGO Programs.

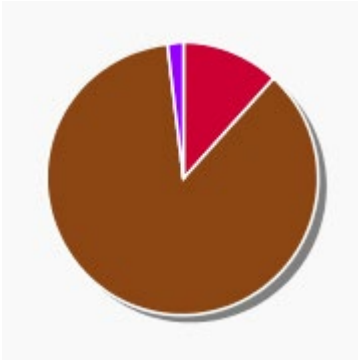
New programs:

Our 75+ volunteers, many of them experts in their respective fields, donate many of their valuable hours to research and educate the public on peace and human security.

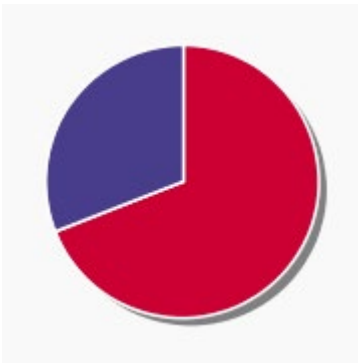
FINANCIAL SUMMARY
